- The success of the 180 years celebrations last weekend were due to the work of the committee and the many people who contributed to the display, catering and liturgy. Congratulations and thanks to everyone involved. Due to my failure to apply GST to the dinner, concert and sale of books, we will be lucky to cover costs.
- Speaking of finance, we were told that the asbestos audit of parishes would cost \$1,900 and be payed over two years. Yass has been hit with a bill of \$3,160 and Gunning \$1,780. At least one small country parish had been charged in excess of \$9,000. There are people sitting in comfortable city offices inventing new ways to financially crush others.
- On the 23rd September, the Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated at a 10am Mass. This year we only have fifteen confirmandi and I ask for your prayerful support for these young people and their families.
- Mass Thursday morning will revert to the normal time of 7:30am.
- Next week I hope to have organized a survey in preparation for the Plenary Council 2020 discussions.

Be Doers of the Word

The need to be listened to is great. The chaplain at a hospital for people with special needs, told of a sad case of a Greek man in an institution who was thought to be a hopeless schizophrenic. The man had been vegetating in the hospital for years. No one knew much about him or where he came from, but all agreed he was a hopeless case. The chaplain asked the Greek Orthodox priest in the community to pay the man a visit, just to give the poor fellow a chance to speak in his native tongue as much as for any pastoral reasons. He hadn't had a chance to do this for years.

The Greek Orthodox priest returned from the visit and asked the chaplain, "What in the world is that fellow doing there? He's as healthy as you and I". Bit by bit the tragic story unfolded.

The Greek had jumped ship long ago in a nearby port. Speaking no English, he had gotten into some sort of trouble and as mistakes sometimes happen, he was locked up in an institution. There he slowly learned English, but he learned his English from schizophrenic patients.

Certain language misuse is characteristic of that mental dysfunction, and the poor Greek fellow managed to learn totally schizophrenic English. To all English personnel he sounded schizophrenic and as removed from reality as his fellow patients. The priest, however, conversed with him in Greek, the first time anyone had done that in the hospital, and the man spoke perfectly correct Greek. The hospital staff were humbled and were taught a lesson by the experience.

age of 18 to become a nun, my mother told me something beautiful and very strange". She said, 'You go put your hand in Jesus' hand and walk along with him.'" And that was the secret of Mother Teresa's life ever after. (Rev. King Duncan). Many of us here have good jobs, we live in nice homes, and we have easy situations. But we don't have the warm smile on our faces that this little nun, working in the most desperate situation imaginable, had on her face. What's the difference? It may be that we've never put our hand in Jesus' hand. It may be that we have him only on our lips as St. James remarks in the second reading and as Jesus remarks in today's Gospel.

Ritual washing using drinking-water: William Barclay in *The Daily Study Bible* tells the story of an old Jewish rabbi in the Roman prison diagnosed with acute dehydration which would have led to his death. The prison guards insisted that the rabbi had been given his quota of drinking water. So, the prison doctor and the officer in charge instructed the guards to watch the rabbi and ascertain what he was doing with his ration of water. They were shocked to find that the rabbi was using almost all his water for traditional ritual washing before prayer and meals. Today's Gospel tells us how the tradition-addicted Pharisees started questioning Jesus when his disciples omitted the ritual washing of hands in public before a meal.
