Who Do You Say Jesus Is?

We're tempted to applaud when Peter gives the right answer. The other disciples fumble around, giving Jesus the daily buzz about what people are saying about him. But when Jesus asks them what they personally think, only Peter has an answer. It's enough to make them want to cheer.

Especially because Peter is so often the gospel bungler, the guy who speaks first, thinks afterwards. He's the guy, not unlike ourselves, who defends Jesus with a sword one minute, denies him with a word the next. And unfortunately, the same holds true in this instance as well. Even as we're tempted to clap, Peter is already shooting himself in the foot. He knew the right answer, but he can't follow through on it. He knows Jesus is the Christ, but he still doesn't want him to get hurt.

And, the truth is, Peter doesn't want to get hurt either. If he accepts the teachings about the Son of Man being murdered, then he's got to wonder when they'll be coming after him. So Jesus calls him the Devil, which must have cut deep. And then advises that they too prepare to lose their lives if they're going to be his followers. Peter got the answer right, the first time. He, like the rest of us, just needs to work on the follow-through.

Shakespeare and Jesus.

It was the 19th century British essayist, Charles Lamb, who snatched the 17th century playwright William Shakespeare from his undeserved obscurity, returning him to the limelight of fame. Charles Lamb was once involved in a discussion on the question of who the greatest literary genius of all time had been. Two names finally emerged: William Shakespeare and Jesus of Nazareth. Lamb put an end to the debate when he said: "I'll tell you the difference between these two men. If Shakespeare walked into this room right now, we would all rise to greet him, but if Christ came in, we would all fall down and worship." There is the essential difference between the Man from Nazareth and all the other great people you can think of. Jesus Christ is God, and all others, no matter what their deeds, are but fools strutting on the stage for a brief time and then exiting. Today's Gospel describes who Jesus really is and gives us the unique conditions for Christian discipleship.

I see millions of stars:

The story is told of Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson on a camping trip. As they lay sleeping one night, Holmes woke Watson and said, "Watson, look up into the sky and tell me what you see." Watson said, "I see millions of stars." Holmes asked, "And what does that tell you?" Watson replied, "Astronomically, it tells me that there are millions of galaxies and potentially billions of planets. Theologically, it tells me that God is great and that we are small and insignificant. Meteorologically, it tells me that we will have a beautiful day tomorrow. And what does it tell you?" Holmes answered, "Someone stole our tent." Some people are great at speculative knowledge but when it comes to its implication for practical living they score zero. Such is Peter in today's Gospel.

COMMUNION REFLECTION

Thinking God's way.

Jesus died at the hands of violent people, and his disciples would have spared him or told him to live in such a way that no harm would come to him.

But God's way was the way of love, the type of love that is proved in hardship, the type of love that is understood only in God.

Illness for many years may seem like a waste of time to some; but we also see that within the illness was a strength that was life-giving to many, and through it a deep love and faith was born, even in times of hardship and frustration for a person who is ill and for carers.

God's way is not to see illness, disability or confusion, failure or mistakes, as a waste, but as a way to love; for in the fragility of life we discover some of the deepest truths of human life.

It is God's way to see the child of God in everyone, God's way to forgive and be reconciled, God's way to work for justice and peace, God's way to see, in the weakness of death, the strong promise of eternity.

God sees no waste in life for in everything love can grow and God can be found. And that was the way for Jesus who said that the Son of Man was to suffer grievously, be put to death, and on the third day rise again.

Jesus once condemned to death, now raised to life in the love of God.
