# Thoughts from the Presbytery



## FEASTS OF THE WEEK

**Mon:** St Francis Xavier      **Fri:** St Ambrose Bishop and Doctor

Advent, from the Latin *adventus* meaning coming, is a special season in preparation for Christmas. The Church not only prepares to welcome Him at Christmas, it also rejoices in the possession and the presence of its Lord in its midst. All through the year we are summoned to prepare the way of the Lord, to hear the voice of Him who is even now in their midst to prepare for his second coming by living the mystery of Christ in the present.

Due to the busyness of this time of the year, we can be distracted and lose sight of the simple and profound truth, God is with us. I hope to be reconciled with those people I have hurt and to enter more deeply into the mystery of a God of infinite mercy. There will be ample opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation and a communal celebration at 6pm, 21<sup>st</sup> December.

The survey for the Plenary Council 2020 is now closed and we look forward to the analysis of those issues you would like presented. At our deanery meeting this week, it was decided to have four representatives from each parish to meet at North Goulburn on the first Saturday of March 2019. This will be the opportunity to progress our concerns to the Archdiocesan level of consultation.

St. Augustine's Finance Committee held a meeting this week and welcomed Trish Gibbs as a new member. We have discussed ways of simplifying our accounts and hope, as usual, to present the annual report in March. Accountability requires complete transparency and if any parishioner has concerns, please speak with a member.

I have been reading Richard Rohr's, "Falling Upwards", which I can recommend to anyone trying to understand themselves in this postmodern era. "Sin happens whenever we refuse to keep growing." (Gregory of Nyssa)

Please pray for Trish Chipangura and Georgia Whitaker, who are discerning entry into our community of faith through baptism at the Easter Vigil.

**Missing the signal!** In its day, the Titanic was the world's largest ship, weighing 46,328 tons, and it was considered unsinkable. Yet, late during the night of April 14-15, 1912, the unthinkable happened to the unsinkable. Near midnight, the great Titanic struck an iceberg, ripping a three-hundred-foot hole through five of its sixteen watertight compartments. It sank in two and a half hours killing 1,513 people. Before the Titanic sank, warning after warning had been sent to tell the crew that they were speeding into an ice field, but the messages were ignored. In fact, when a nearby ship sent an urgent warning, the Titanic was talking to Cape Race about the time the chauffeurs were to meet arriving passengers at the dock in New York, and what dinner menus were to be ready. Preoccupied with the trivia, the Titanic responded to the warning, "Shut up. I am talking to Cape Race. You are jamming my signals!" Why did so many die that night? Perhaps the crew disregarded the danger of the weather; there were not enough lifeboats on board; and the radio operator of nearby *California* was off duty; perhaps those responsible did not heed the warnings; they were preoccupied with other things! -Sometimes we believe that our 'ship' is unsinkable, our life is all well planned, and the unthinkable can never happen to us. We need to read the signs of the times, we need to pay attention to the warning signals. But if we are preoccupied with the trivial things of life we will miss the most important things till it is too late. The First Sunday of Advent gives us the warning to be watchful, waiting and prepared.

## **Be prepared ...**

Have you ever heard the story of the ant and the grasshopper? It tells the tale of a grasshopper who has spent the summer singing and so is not prepared when winter comes, whereas the ant has been working hard all summer and has stored up enough food for winter. Like many of Aesop's Fables, it has a stark moral lesson, in this case about the virtue of hard work and being prepared for the future.

The problem, of course, is that we have no idea when this will happen. Unlike the ant and the grasshopper, we have no way of knowing when the seasons will change. We don't even know when the sun will set on our own individual lives. All we can do is to be prepared and to 'stay awake' – to live now in such a way that when we meet Jesus, we will be ready. This readiness is less a practical skill than a condition, or a way of life. Look at how St Paul describes it: he talks about increasing our love for one another, and continually making progress in living the life that God wants. That is how we store up treasures here on earth to make sure we are ready for the heavenly things to come.

Then, from somewhere in the back of the elevator came a single voice that said, "Don't worry. They already crucified him."

**Sign on a Church bulletin board:** "Merry Christmas to our Christian friends. Happy Hanukkah to our Jewish friends. And to our atheist friends, good luck."

Many young people struggle with fear today. I know young people that are afraid of failing tests and young people that are afraid of losing friends. I know young people that are afraid of gangs and violence. Fear is pretty normal, so don't feel ashamed if you feel it.

When you feel fear "*stand tall and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand*". Where can you get this courage? Luke tells us to pray and be vigilant, which means we must think carefully about a Christian response before important decisions.
