

At the funeral of our young Aboriginal brother this past week, I was reminded of the suffering experienced by the families of those gathered, too many premature deaths. It's extremely difficult to maintain social distancing on occasions such as this, mindful of the need to comfort the sorrowing. I spoke with Aunty Glenda Merritt, a beautiful friend, of the desire of our community to own past hurts caused by occupying their sacred site on which St. Augustine's was built. She assured me the Aboriginal community of Yass would come together to see how our communities can heal past hurts. There is great admiration for the support given by the priests, especially Fr. Lovat, and the Mercy Sisters to the Aboriginal community over nearly two centuries. As you are aware, this issue was discussed at the last meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council as expressed by the Chair of the PPC, reprinted on this bulletin. Those interested in being involved in this process, please speak with Sarah Johnston.

WALKING TOGETHER: THE JOURNEY TO HEALING AND RECONCILIATION

In his recent Welcome to Country on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday, Michael Bell stirred the hearts and minds of many of our parishioners with his eloquent description of the historically good relationship between the Ngunnawal people of Yass, Father Lovat, the parishioners of St Augustine's parish and the Sisters of Mercy. However, it also became evident that there were elements of our shared history that were not so positive particularly the establishment of the original St Augustine's Church on the site of an Aboriginal Bora Ring. Michael Bell met this week with Father Mick and members of the Parish Pastoral Council to discuss the best approach to a healing journey. Michael explained that if we can use this history to now bring the community together we can start healing process. The journey begins with thorough research and telling the story of the history of the incident and public acknowledgment of the significance of location. There can then be ceremony/commemoration and/or establishment of a public art work which builds a pathway for both communities. As well as building strong and respectful relationships within our church and community, "The ultimate goal," said Michael, "is to tell the true story of Yass through the Aboriginal and parish history and in doing so put this church on the map". Who wouldn't want to be a part of that creative, healing journey?!

Please start thinking about whether you have particular gifts and skills that you would like to put to the service of the St Augustine's Parish Reconciliation Action Plan.

A Rock Solid Foundation
