FEASTS OF THE WEEK

Wed: Saints Simon and Jude

Archbishop Prowse will visit St. Augustine's on the 12th November, a pastoral visit to spend time in prayer with parishioners and conclude with morning tea. I encourage as many parishioners as possible to attend and for the purpose of catering, please indicate if you are coming by telephoning the office.

Due to the generosity of Anthony MacQuillan, the book entitled 'Shepherd of Shepherds' is available at the back of the church at no cost. Designed and edited by Peter Bindon and Anthony MacQuillan, this is a wonderful insight into the extraordinary life of Fr. Charles Lovat the first parish priest of Yass.

I received an email from Sister Mila who runs the orphanage in Oecusse who assured me that they are okay but went on to say "No one knows what lies ahead in Oecusse. People are hungry, no work and those in service here have not received their salary". The orphanage is sharing their vegetables and water with the poor. I am extremely grateful to Gunning parish for a contribution in excess of \$7,000 to support this dire situation in Oecusse. I also thank regular contributors as we outreach to the poorest of the poor in our region.

At the Minister's Fraternal meeting this week, we discussed support for our RE teacher at Yass High. A couple from our community contributed \$3,000 towards the salary of Jess, greatly appreciated as we need to raise \$20,000 per annum to employ her for this important apostolate.

What Holy Families Can Look Like

In the summer of 2020, our parish, and the world, lost a vessel of unconditional love when Matt died of brain cancer at the age of 55. Matt adored his wife, Katie, and was an incomparable dad to his three kids. Though not a Catholic himself, he actively supported Katie in raising a Catholic family and all five could be found every Sunday morning in their favoured front pew at our church.

Family and friends gathered for a funeral Mass with the song "All Are Welcome" resounding in the nave: "Let us build a house where love can dwell and all can safely live". That is precisely what Matt and Katie did in their 31 years of marriage. They built a house where love could and did grow and safely live.

On that funeral day, as I looked at Matt's family, standing in their usual front row, I felt like we were seeing the magnificent love of God made visible in our midst. Katie, strong, honest, and unassumingly good; Parker, the oldest son, born with a brain disorder, who had grown up in the parish, teaching us all the gifts of specially abled people; Lily, the daughter of colour who was adopted as a baby, an exploring spirit who found a niche on the Aldi staff and who returned to live at home these last few months to be nearby; and Reed, adopted as a baby, now mature beyond his school years, who began his remarkable eulogy with: "I am my father's favourite black son".

There they stood that February morning in their pew, shoulder to shoulder, holding each other's hands as the song resounded in the nave. The beloved family embodies the broad, vast, and inclusive love of God. And in their generosity, they have called out the best in us all for nearly 30 years.

Love

The Pharisees continue their harassment of Jesus in today's Gospel by asking him which commandment is the greatest. What follows is the most famous verses of the New Testament: '*You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul ... And ... You shall love your neighbour as yourself.*' We probably can't hear this enough. Love is the greatest commandment and this is a radical statement. Because this love is *agape* love, i.e. a love of those we don't even know or even like! It is a love that binds all of humanity.

We cannot separate love of God and neighbour; they are like two sides of a coin; they only work together. If we do not treat others with compassion, then how can we say we love God? Jesus often spoke about approaching the altar whilst holding a grudge against someone (Mt 5:24) and continuously challenged those who were hypocrites. Those critical of social justice movements in the church often say we should not be involved in doing 'social work'. But this is exactly what we must do because this is *how* we love God, by loving our neighbour who is suffering, who is oppressed, who is in pain. We can love God and love people, there does not have to be a dichotomy.

There is a beautiful practice in India of using the mystical phrase '*Namaste*' in greetings, which means: 'the Divine in me greets the Divine in you'. Usually this is accompanied by a deep bow towards the person. How wonderful it would be to really see God present in each other and, more importantly, in those that society would rather cast aside. In this way we are being true to the greatest commandment.

'May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received, and pass on the love that has been given to you.'
