The Archbishop's pastoral visit was attended by twenty-three parishioners, two from Gunning and the others from Yass. I am grateful to Lourdes and her team for supplying food and serving morning tea.

Next Sunday at both Masses in St. Augustine's we will celebrate First Holy Communion with twenty-three younger parishioners. We can legally accommodate 130 at each Mass and eleven pews will be reserved for the families of the communicants. The choir loft will be open and I just hope we don't exceed our numbers.

Margaret Friend has resigned as co-ordinator of the catechists and we will be looking for a replacement for next year. Thanks Margaret for what you have done. We desperately need more catechists, as a third of the children attending Berinba and Yass Primary are Catholics. Please keep this important apostolate in your prayers.

Mount Carmel Community Council will meet this coming Thursday.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions on numbers, we are planning to celebrate Mass at Christmas outside. Gunning will hold the Mass at 5:30pm as usual and St. Augustine's will be held outside the Hartigan Centre at 7pm. As very few attend the 8:30am on Christmas Day, it will be held in St. Augustine's church. We are permitted 300 attendees outside.

Rising to the challenge

It is hard not to feel sorry for the third servant in today's gospel. The first two servants are praised for making the most of the 'talents' (money) given to them by their master. In return, they are promised even greater things. The third man, paralysed by uncertainty, buries his small amount of money in the ground instead of doing something with it. His actions are based in fear – he has heard the master is tough and he does not want to take any risks. At least he is able to return what he has been given, he reasons.

But he is shocked to learn that instead of praise, or even a neutral reaction to match his own neutral actions, he is reprimanded as 'wicked and lazy' and cast out. This parable has been described as a story of 'tragic miscalculation'. The servant didn't do anything awful – which is why we tend to have some sympathy for him – but he didn't do his best either. The real tragedy is not that he didn't make any more money; it is that he failed to appreciate the opportunity he had been given and to make the most of it.

We are all dealt different cards in life, and undoubtedly some are much tougher than others. We are like the servants in the parable who are given different amounts of money to look after. The point is not the amount of 'talents' given to each. It is not the circumstances of our lives or our natural gifts that are important, but how we use them. Jesus was cautioning against playing it safe. Instead of turning inwards or living in fear, we are called to meet challenges head on and discover what wonderful things might happen.

Moving On

I had a friend whose father worked a lot of evenings and also travelled a lot for his job. He once told me, "I was always relieved when I heard Dad's footstep on the stairs coming up to our unit. Life never seemed quite right when he was away, and for a while I found myself becoming withdrawn and depressed during his absences".

Though God never leaves us, there are times we experience the absence of God. This week's gospel begins by saying that the landowner was leaving - going on a journey. The story revolves around what happens in the landowner's absence. Some people stay busy and involved in life, putting their "talents" to really good use. Others withdraw from life and get disengaged.

Perhaps one of the best benefits of having faith, even in those times when we don't feel God's presence, is that it gives us the confidence to continue to function well in life - physically, emotionally, and spiritually - despite our uncertainties.

This is one of the biggest gifts that parents can nurture in their children - the ability to have faith even in times of doubt. We will all go through times of confusion. But the worst thing we can do at such times is to withdraw our gifts and our talents from the world. For it is putting them to good use that we're most likely to hear God's footsteps and know that all is well.

**You entrusted me with two talents;
here are two more I have made.**

We are familiar with the story of the boy who wanted to bring a gift to Jesus at his birth. He saw others bringing expensive gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh; he wondered what he had to offer, and thought of his drum, and how he could play a song for Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

A simple story, and isn't it true about our gifts and talents?
